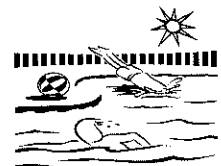

A Message from the Superintendent**

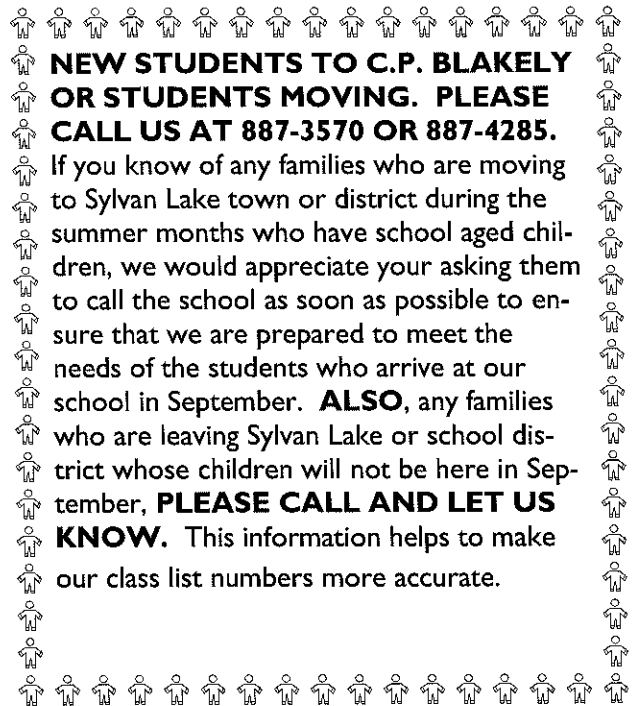

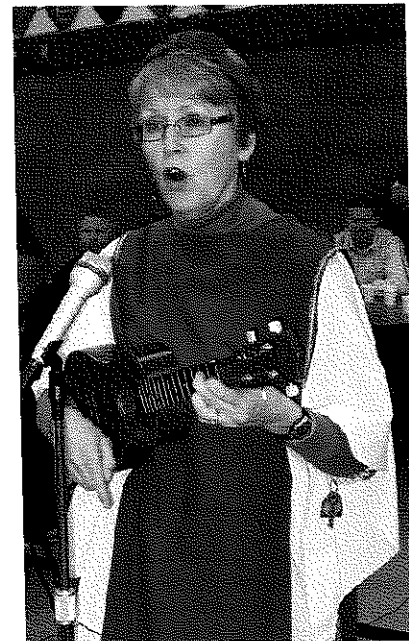
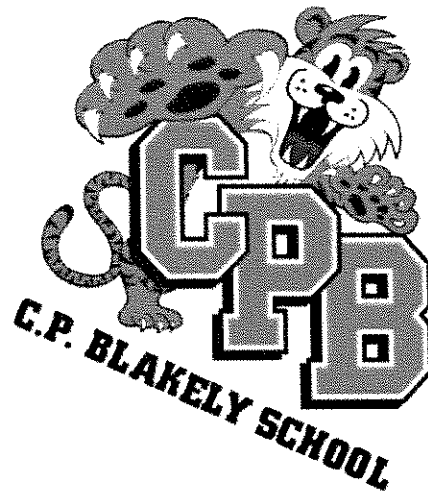

Ensure you and your child are protected against Red Measles

There have been many cases of red measles in British Columbia and we have begun to see cases in Alberta. The majority of measles cases have occurred in unimmunized individuals, with many needing medical attention and/or hospitalization.

There is **no** treatment for measles but it can be prevented with immunization. We are encouraging all parents to ensure children have received measles immunization (MMR vaccine) for protection from the measles disease. Most adults born before 1970 are immune to measles. Adults born in 1970 or after should have at least one dose of measles-containing vaccine to be protected.

What is the MMR vaccine?

The MMR vaccine protects against **Measles, Mumps and Rubella**. It is provided free as part of routine childhood immunizations through Public Health.

Who should get the MMR vaccine?

The MMR vaccine is given to children as a series of two doses. The first dose is given at 12 months of age and the second at 4-6 years of age. **Please contact Sylvan Lake Public Health at 403-887-2241 if you are unsure if your child has received the appropriate doses of MMR vaccine, and to book an immunization appointment if needed.**

What is red measles?

Red measles is a **severe illness** caused by the measles virus. Red measles can cause serious side effects such as seizures, deafness or brain damage. Other complications can include ear infections and pneumonia. One in every 100 people who get red measles requires hospitalization.

How is red measles spread?

Red measles is very contagious and spreads easily. When an infected person breathes, coughs, or sneezes, the virus spreads through the air.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms of red measles include fever, cough, runny nose and red, inflamed eyes (often sensitive to light) and a rash which starts first on the face and neck and spreads to the chest, arms and legs.

If you think you or your child have red measles

If you have fever and a rash and think you may have red measles, have yourself examined by a Doctor or call HealthLink Alberta at 1-866-408-5465. Before going to a doctor's office or emergency department, it is best to call ahead. This infection can spread to susceptible people quickly in places like waiting rooms, emergency rooms and schools. The doctor or triage nurse can make sure that you are taken into a closed area for an examination and attend a clinic at a time when the waiting room is empty. Bring your immunization record with you.

Roots of Empathy is a program for children in kindergarten to grade 8. The program's aim is to increase empathy - the ability to understand another person's feelings.

Children learn to care and respect each other and there is less bullying and aggression.

A Roots of Empathy family:

- A mother and/or father visits a classroom in a local school with a Roots of Empathy Instructor.
- The visits are about 30 minutes long, once a month from October until June.
- The program helps children to learn about a baby's needs and how babies develop and lets children observe the loving relationship between a parent and baby.
- Babies must be 2 to 4 months old in October.

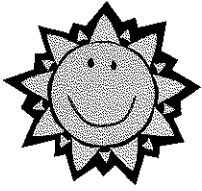

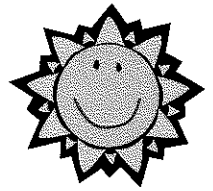
