Dear Parent Council,

Before we initiate our request, it is important that you know that all staff and students appreciate your effort, dedication, and support of C. P. Blakely. We are blessed because of everything you are involved in, from the dances to the hot lunch program to fundraisers, which support the school by way of In-line skating, Artist In Residency programs and other needs within the school!

In the grade 5 Electricity unit, we have been using circuit boards for years to help students learn about series and parallel circuits via hands-on learning. However, the lightbulbs we use in circuit boards are becoming a challenge to locate because they are being manufactured less or replaced by LED lights. Without replacing the circuit boards by updating them, we are

requesting a bulk purchase of small light bulbs which would fit into the sockets we currently have. We are hoping to purchase enough to have a stash for a few years down the road. We maintain the circuit boards and lightbulbs quite carefully, but attrition occurs and our current supply is getting drastically low.

After searching various locations in Red Deer and on-line, the most practical bulbs were found at Gregg's Distributors for about \$1.50 per bulb. We are requesting about 4 dozen (48, or even 50 bulbs), which cost approximately \$80.
